

5. Data

The first club was founded in Järvenpää. The Charter book was signed in England on 1 July 1958 and was admitted on 25 October 1958 in the Charter ceremony by district president Inez Trotzig from Sweden. District 140 (northern Finland) and 142 (southern Finland) were founded in the same year 1986 as the first districts in Finland. District 140 was divided into three districts (139, 140 and 141) in 1991. The National Governing Body, NGB was established in 2000.
